Peter invited all to join him in the Rotary Invocation plus a toast to the Matildas – whose match against Ireland, in the first round of the FIFA Women's World Cup, was imminent.



Numerous apologies were recorded from members unable to attend (thank you!) but disturbingly still some members failed to react to the Event Create email and record their intentions. Administration Matters.

President Peter touched upon the following matters: -

- 1. The barbecue at the Wagga Swap Meeting was a success both as a Club binding activity as well as financially. There were many volunteer helpers and they actually sold out of all produce.
- 2. An invitation to an event at Pro-Patria, to mark the actual purchase of the asset from the Catholic Order of Saint Clare nuns, has been received. The event is scheduled for 10:00 AM on 31st August. All members are invited and encouraged to attend. A RSVP is required no later than 21st August (speak with Pres Peter)
- 3. Reminders about:

She modelled her new 'T' shirt (see photo) supporting Rotary's action against Domestic Violence and the Zone 8 Conference (22nd October). An entertaining, educational and financially (at least for the Club) session.



Extract From TROVE - Our Club History - Meeting Report from 20th July 1948: -

WAGGA ROTARY CLUB'S SOCIAL GATHERING.

The weekly meeting and luncheon of the Wagga Rotary Club yesterday was varied from the usual routine.

After luncheon and the disposal of several business matters, the meeting resolved itself into a social gathering. With the president (Mr. W. P. Riordan) presiding, a programme of musical items was contributed by members. These items were a Dutch auction for the disposal of 26 pounds of white sugar donated by a couple of members. Mr. R. Norman supervised the 'auction' and received a donation from each person in the room. The proceeds, about £2, is a contribution to the funds of the South Wagga Baby Clinic. Mr. W. Carr received the parcel of sugar.

At a previous meeting, Mr. J. Sneirs received several tins of asparagus, and the South Wagga Baby Clinic was given the proceeds. These 'auctions' will be held at meetings from time to time, as will the donations to pay for food parcels to be sent to English Rotary Clubs for distribution to worthy people.

The musical programme was conducted by Mr. Norman Peek. The soloists were Dr. R. Holmes (piano), Mr. N. Peek (song), Mr. Ivan Plercy (saw solo). There were three community songs


