Last week we published our second instalment of the article by Leanne Martin-Pollock (R C Dar es Salaam, Oysterbay, Tanzania) detailing the second five (of twenty) reasons reminding us of what motivated us to join, and to continue to enjoy, our Rotary Club. In this week's edition, we outline the subsequent five expressed points: -

 helps to make one a better doctor, lawyer, teacher, etc.
- The Development of Ethics: Rotarians practice a 4-Way Test that governs one's ethical standards. Rotarians are expected to be ethical in business and personal relationships.

ROTARY CLUB OF WAGGA WAGGA - OUR HISTORY: -

Extract From **TROVE** - Our Club History – Meeting Report dated 19th September 1933: -

At the usual weekly meeting of members of the Wagga Rotary Club, held last evening at the Commercial Hotel, the president (Rotarian J. C. Blamey) was in the chair. Several members were absent from town and apologies were submitted. The 'talk' for the occasion was given by Rotarian H. Mc Crossin who took as his subject the handling of His Majesty's mails through the post office. The speaker gave a very interesting discourse in which he described in detail, the. electrically driven mechanical sorting, equipment installed at the cost of £120,000 in the. Sydney GPO and which was giving practically 100 percent efficiency. Its installation was due to an invention by Mr. Corbett, now director of postal and telegraph services at Brisbane, who a comparatively few years ago was deputed by the director of postal services to make a study of mechanical sorting, the outcome of which was the retting up of a small plant at Brisbane at a cost of a few hundred pounds. This small equipment was so thoroughly efficient that Mr. Corbett's design was given effect to at Sydney G.P.O. Rotarian Mc Crossin's discourse was listened to with very great interest, many of those present, having no previous idea of the enormous amount of work involved in the handling of the huge pile of postal matter in the Sydney office
