Emily Brosco made her first presentation to the Club, but the anxiety level was probably higher than she could have expected, having the District Governor in the audience. She spoke about her family and growing up in Temora and developing a love of English language and literature. After completing 4 years of High School in Temora she went off to Sydney to Loreto Normanhurst - a Catholic Girls School to complete Years 11 and 12. She drew on the legacy of the Foundress of the Loreto Order of Sisters, Mary Ward (born in England in 1585) who had proclaimed that, "women in time will come to do much", and so they have.

This two years furthered her love of English and she went on and trained and became an English teacher. At age 27 Emily left the classroom and set up her own business to help teachers, again drawing on Mary Ward who believed the teaching community had to reach out and engage others. A decade or so on, she is doing this by running training sessions and producing books and material to assist teachers in their careers. Congratulations Emily, it was an excellent, thoughtful presentation.

Fines-Master Session.

Our Fines Master was Vicky Donoghue. After bemoaning how out of date our Club website was, and putting her hand up to try and coordinate a re-vamp, she took us on a walk down memory lane. Seeking fines for our lack of knowledge she worked her way through selected Paul Harris Fellowships that our Club has bestowed over the last 40 years, and concentrated on recipients that were still members of our Club. For a fee he reminded us who were the Presidents and what was the theme for each particular year. A lot of old memories were rekindled.

Guest Speaker for the night was District 9705 Governor Andrea Grosvenor from Queanbeyan, and she was introduced by President Peter. Andrea has a long family history with Rotary. Her father was a Charter Member and President of the Rotary Club of Campbelltown SA, her mother a member and President of Campbelltown Inner Wheel Club, and Andrea a Charter Member of Campbelltown Rotaract Club in the 1970s. She had a 35 year career in the Australian Public Service.

Andrea provided a video of Scottish Rotary International President 2023-24, Gordon R McInally. Gordon who is a very good speaker, introduced himself and spoke about his agenda for his term in office and how he came up with his theme of "Create Hope in the World". It was based on a chance meeting in Thailand after the Tsunami in 2011. It had devastated this lady's life, washing away her family and home and she was left alone, homeless and desolate. Her hopes were revived years later by Rotary participating in the recovery and rebuilding of her town, providing encouragement and infrastructure so the town could function again.

Andrea described our 9705 District. It covers about 2 thirds of regional NSW. It includes 72 Rotary Clubs, 1800 Rotarians, 4 Rotaract Clubs, 2 Interact Clubs and 2 Earlyact Clubs for Primary School students. Wagga Wagga is in Area 3 and the Area Governor is Garth Perkins from Coolamon.

She spoke about international Rotary programs such as Polio Plus, and new initiatives with a focus on domestic and family violence, mental health, disaster response and regionalisation. She also spoke about her own special interests in Australian Rotary programs such as RAWCS, particularly Rotary Against Malaria, ROMAC and Australian Rotary Health.

After a question concerning regionalisation she agreed that there was a lack of information and advised that the 9705 District Board is working hard to improve the level of advice. She also advised that to her knowledge, that there was little, if any, payment to new regional office bearers.

Elaine Almond thanked Andrea, acknowledging that we were fortunate that our Club was the first one in our Area to receive such a visit and presentation.

SEPTEMBER IS BASIC EDUCATION AND LITERACY MONTH

<u>UNESCO International Literacy Day</u> is 8 September. Literacy Day celebrations have taken place annually around the world since 1967.

The Guatemala Literacy Project is working to reverse the country's low literacy rates and keep children in school - By Diana Schoberg

When **Rotary International President Jennifer Jones** visited a primary school in a farming village in Guatemala's highlands in 2022 and asked who wants to become the country's president, the students' hands shot into the air. Before a Rotary-supported reading program began in the village of Chajalajyá, students would often drop out after a couple years of school. "Reading will change our society," Principal Vilma Nizeth Moreira told Jones during an April visit to the school. "These are powerful tools we are giving children to eradicate ignorance." Schools often teach in Spanish, but about 25 languages are spoken in the country, and there are few written materials in local languages.

The Guatemala Literacy Project has worked for 25 years to improve reading rates. In 1997, Joe and Jeff Berninger, brothers from Ohio, were volunteering as English teachers at a Guatemalan school that had no books. The two launched a project to solve that. The day the books arrived, there was a huge celebration, and a Rotarian dentist volunteering nearby heard the noise and asked what was going on. "He said this would be a perfect project for Rotary," says Joe Berninger, now a member of the Rotary Club of Pathways, Ohio, which coordinates the project.

ROTARY CLUB OF WAGGA WAGGA - OUR HISTORY: -

Extract From TROVE - Our Club History - Meeting Report - Daily Advertiser dated 27 September 1933. (Relevant to this time of year, as well as Pres. Peter's current role - Courtesy Don Pembleton)

The weekly meeting and luncheon of members of the Wagga Rotary Club was held on Monday evening at the Commercial Hotel, when the president (Rotarian J. C. Blarney) presided. The principal guests of the evening were three of the adjudicators at the Wagga Eisteddfod – Rotarian Lawrence Campbell and Messrs. Roland Foster and Brewster Jones. Each of the guests gave short 'talks' on different phases of the eisteddfod, congratulating the people of Wagga for their initiative and courage in boosting such a very desirable institution as the Wagga Eisteddfod Society. The president expressed his appreciation of the 'talks' and said that the eisteddfod owed much to the adjudicators of this year and of other years for the high standard they had set which bad such a good influence on the musical appreciation of both the competitors and the public.
