Some of the fines which were hung on different members were:


- "I don't mind coming to work, but the 8 hours wait to go home is just ridiculous."

Our guest speaker was Laura Telford from Canberra. She is the immediate Past Chairman of Rotaract Australia MDIO, and a Zone 8 Regionalisation Steering Group Committee Member 2021-2024.

Under difficult circumstances (an electrical problem at the RSL resulted in no microphone, and the projector failing to connect with the computer, so visuals were restricted to laptops), Laura informed members about the implementation of the Regionalisation Pilot which is due to commence

soon. The purpose of the re-organisation is to try and stop the downward trend of Rotary membership. Under the proposed new structure there will be a Regional Council and under them, District Officers who will oversee interaction between clubs.



The local club is still at the centre of the structure with group specialists available to help with any problems such as membership, governance, youth programs, administration, legal advice, and public image. There are 18 districts in the current zone, and a multi-national Advisory Committee sits above all the clubs in the zone.





A survey is being released at the end of the month, and each member is asked to participate. These surveys will then be returned, and clubs will be grouped according to the results and interests portrayed from the

The project is anticipated to commence in the middle of next year. John Heazlewood thanked Laura for taking the time to travel from Canberra to be with us and for persevering in the face of the technology issues.


