

Graham's presentation was from the well-known publication '*The Sentimental Bloke*' and related a story, in Aussie slang, of one of our WW1 soldiers who, whilst being billeted in Britain had an encounter with an aristocratic lady. It was titled '*A Diggers Tale*'.
